We are so excited to be partnering with the Virden Knights of Columbus to host a Fried Chicken Dinner this year!



and their work, Pope Francis reflects on the Gospel parable of the Wedding Banquet, where the king tells his servants "Go therefore to the thoroughfares and invite to the marriage feast as many as you find".

The invitation to the banquet is linked to the Eucharistic table, where believers share the Body and Blood of Christ, anticipating the final banquet.

As Pope Benedict XVI pointed out: "We cannot keep to ourselves the love we celebrate in the Sacrament [of the Eucharist]. By its very nature, it asks to be communicated to everyone. What the world needs is the love of God, to encounter Christ and believe in him. For this reason the Eucharist is not only the source and summit of the life of the Church; it is also the source and summit of her mission:

> 'An authentically Eucharistic Church is a missionary Church'" (Sacramentum Caritatis, 84).

of vendors and there will even be some outside! Food and drinks will be available for both breakfast and lunch! Come and browse for a treasure or just come for the food. All are welcome!



<u>On Tuesday, October 22</u> we celebrate the Feast of St. John Paul II

On April 2, 2005, the vigil of the feast of Divine Mercy, John Paul II died. His last words were whispered, "Let me go to my Father's house." Some 3 million people came to Rome for his funeral, and millions more followed on television. They had heard when this Pope had told them not to be afraid, and they understood that in those last years and months, he had told them this in the most profound way possible. In 2011, Pope Benedict XVI beatified his predecessor, and in 2013, Pope Francis declared him a saint.
